(IUP) Chinese Language Credit Recognition Rules

Passed on December 26, 2005 at Academic Affairs Meeting

Revised on June 5, 2006 at Academic Affairs Meeting

Revised on October 1, 2008 during the 615th Administrative Meeting

Article 1 These Rules are established in response to the Ministry of Education's policy to increase the number of international students and in compliance with the general education framework at National Chengchi University (NCCU).

Article 2 Students in the International Undergraduate Program (IUP) refer to international students who have been admitted by NCCU and approved by the Office of International Cooperation. These students are enrolled in IUP courses, do not speak Chinese as a native language and are linguistically capable of receiving lessons in English. Chinese language courses will be recognized as general education credits as there is a lack of a comprehensive education in the Chinese language.

Article 3 Chinese language courses in the first and second year will be held for ten hours per week and six credits per semester. Students who have received a passing score may apply for recognition of general education credits. There are a total of twenty four credits. The other four to eight general education credits may be selected from NCCU's list of general education courses at the student's discretion.

Article 4 These Rules shall be implemented in the 2005 academic year with the approval of the Committee of the General Education Center and the Academic Affairs Meeting.
